2004/2005 report

The 2004/2005 Financial Reports continue the pleasing trend of the last three years, building on previous profits of \$57,000 and \$67,176 with a profit in 2004/2005 of \$55,755. Members' equity has now risen to \$153,986. Most importantly, the good financial results continue to be achieved without compromising services provided to members.

Significant in the good financial result was increased revenue derived from a number of sources, including:

1. Increased sponsorship, particularly from a new partnership with Novartis.
2. One off projects for the Department of Health & Ageing.
3. Increased merchandise revenue, particularly pedometers.

Also significant was a continued reduction in General Expenses.

Unlike 2003/2004, revenue from the national conference was not a significant

SMA conferences have to serve the twin and competing objectives of providing a service to members while generating income for SMA and our conference partners, the Discipline Groups. The 2003 Conference provided a dividend for distribution amongst the participating Discipline Groups of \$35,000 and a very high level of delegate satisfaction, based on the delegate response forms. Delegates were particularly impressed with the quality of the keynote speakers, Professors Roald Bahr and Hakan Alfredson, with other standout highlights the "Great Debate", the "Hypothetical" and the inclusion of structured mentoring and wine to the Poster session. The success of the Conference is very much a reflection of the work of the Conference Committee and Conference co-Chairs, Professor Wendy Brown and Dr Anita Green, and SMA Conference Manager, Rainer Wilton.

The increase in popularity of SMA publications with advertisers is a reflection of the value added by the members who provide their services as editors, reviewers or contributors. Most spectacular has been the increase in profile of the Journal of Science and Medicine in Sport (JSMS) under the direction of Editor, Professor Caroline Finch. The JSMS has now achieved an "impact factor" amongst scientific journals because of the increase in the number of times JSMS articles are cited in other journals. While the JSMS is scheduled for quarterly publication, in 2004, members will actually receive two supplementary editions: one containing the abstracts from the 2004 Conference and in March, a special edition containing the latest evidence for the benefits of physical activity for health and what works in interventions promoting activity. The Physical Activity edition was largely due to the initiative of SMA's Public Health Spokesperson, Professor Wendy Brown, and seeding funding from the Australian Sports Medicine Federation Fellows.

While SMA no longer receives direct funding support from the Federal Government, supplementary income is generated from time to time when SMA undertakes projects on behalf of the Government. The most pleasing aspect of recent projects contracted by the Government is that they are much closer to SMA core business: funding to support upgrade of SMA policies and funding for the Physical Activity edition of the JSMS.

The other significant areas of income for the Federation (apart from member contributions) continue to be the Safer Sport Program (SSP) and Sponsorship. The SSP continues to grow and build in most areas and parts of the country and provides a significant support to sports safety in Australia and a return to SMA members for their direct and indirect support of the Program. Victoria continues to be the pacesetter in terms of sheer size and scope of the Program, while the Queensland Branch has pioneered a move into new fields for the SSP by becoming a Registered Training Organisation.

SMA is also very reliant on and grateful to its major sponsors, Asics and Beiersdorf, and direct contacts Mark Doherty (Asics) and Mike Berry (Beiersdorf). The financial support is welcome and necessary, but it is also nice to be able to recommend products that are the best in the marketplace and contribute directly to SMA core business of promoting safe sport and physical activity.

The Federation is always seeking new ways to support members. Recognising that pedometers are likely to become an increasingly popular device for members who wish to encourage increased physical activity amongst their patients, SMA has sought to obtain bulk supplies of the most reliable pedometer, the Yamax Digiwalker, and provide these to members as a service at close to cost price. The National Board also decided this year that Practice Branding should be viewed entirely as a service to members and the SMA logo made available to all members.

The National Office is very dependent on the hard work and enthusiasm of the staff and all must be thanked for their efforts in the last twelve months – and a unique year in that we had zero staff turnover in the twelve-month period.
